Ask the Pastor

"Why don't Lutherans pray to Mary like our Roman Catholic friends do?"

First, I want to affirm Lutherans do honor the saints. In the Apology to the Augsburg Confession, (a statement of Lutheran Beliefs) Article 21, we confess:


"It is also taught among us that saints should be kept in remembrance so that our faith may be strengthened when we see what grace they received and how they were sustained by faith. Moreover, their good works are to be an example for us, each of us in his own calling."

Lutherans give thanks for the saints as examples of God's mercy, we remember them to strengthen our own faith, and we seek to imitate their faithful service to God.

However, the Lutheran tradition has continued to affirm that Jesus Christ is our intercessor before God, and he can be addressed directly by any believer. There is no need to pray first to Mary (or any of the saints), but instead we are to take our prayers directly to Christ.

We look to the words of Paul in his letter to Timothy,

"for there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself a ransom for all." (1 Timothy 2:5-6)



As Lutherans, we respect Mary, we believe she played an important role as the mother of Jesus, and we look to her example of faithfulness, but we bring our prayers of intercession to Christ, our great high priest before the throne of God.





Rogation Days 2024

Dear Friends in Christ,

No Farm, No Food. This popular statement is most certainly true. In Northwestern Ohio farming is a way of life for many who sit in the pews of area Lutheran Churches. We want to honor and celebrate this important work. Without local farms and farmers our lives would be held hostage by huge corporate conglomerates that look out for their own bottom line, not the well-being of consumers.

How can the church assist farmers during the planting season? **Rogation Days** is an ancient church blessing of farms, farm animals, and farm equipment, around the time of Ascension Day, which is 40 days after Easter. Starting in Europe during the time of the Reformation, church leaders would bless the ground, and animals that would provide the food at the fall harvest. Many of our congregations celebrate Harvest days in the fall; we should also do the same at the beginning of the cycle of planting, growing, and feeding what will produce that harvest in the fall.

We have heard from one church member, "my grandfather never planted a seed until after Ascension Day." This idea certainly comes from the European tradition of Rogation Days. While times have changed and planting is dictated by different metrics, receiving the gift of God's blessing, for the creation of food for God's people, is a metric that is timeless. The pastors of the North Central Conference would like to join together to present the first annual Rogation Days festival.

Teams of pastors and lay leaders will travel around our conference to different farms which desire to receive a blessing of fields, livestock, and equipment. We will not take too much of your valuable time. The dates for the rogation blessings will be May 6,7, and 8. Times will be determined by the interest generated. Please sign up with your Pastor.

Through worship and drama, Bible study, art and science explorations, and active games, children are invited to follow the example and teachings of Jesus in every place and every part of life.



Pastor's Report: Worship Attendance: Worship Attendance In person average for March 2024 - 145.2 compared to Mar 2023 - 121.5. Online average for Mar 2024 - 97.8 compared to Feb 2023 - 81. **Numbers:** 18 hospital/homebound visit/individual or family meetings, 3 committee/group meetings, 6 community/youth/fellowship events, 5 professional/clergy activities, 6 special services, 1 funeral.**Funeral:** On March 7,2024, I presided at the funeral of Katheryn Wilka..

May Committee Night: The North Central Conference (the group of congregations we are part of) is planning Rogation Days (festival days devoted to special prayers for farm equipment and planting crops) culminating in a Conference wide Ascension Day worship service and meal at Solomon, Woodville. There is a signup sheet next to my office to reserve a spot for the meal. May Committee Night rescheduled to May 2, 2024.

Confirmation Sunday: Confirmation Sunday will be May 19th this year. Pastor has recommended that Logan Hays be approved for Affirmation of Baptism.

Parish Education: Deanna Neuman-VBS materials have arrived. Still looking for volunteers. Carol Jensen and Deanna Neuman began going through the Sunday School office to plan for cleaning it up/organizing it. We had 6 kids, and their adults who attended the April 4th Sunday School.
